## Chemo Cap

Knit with a soft yarn for cancer patients.

I like to use a fun fur yarn and baby weight yarn together. You can mix colors to give different look to your cap. Remember the goal is to create a fun pretty cap.

Materials:


Circular needles size 10.5 US

Set of double pointed needles size 10.5 US

Marker

Scissors

yarn

	<p>Cast on 40 stitches with your favorite cast on method onto circular needles.. Make sure all the stitches are going in the same directions.</p>
	<p>Place marker on right needle.</p> <p>Join yarn and knit.</p>
	<p>I like to use two colors, give a ridge or border to the bottom of the cap. Knit until the cap measures 6.5 inches.</p> <p>Option. Rib for 6 inches then knit 3.5 inches. The ribbing can be folded over</p> <p>Knit 6, knit two together. Repeat to end. Knit one row. Knit 5, knit two together. Repeat to end. Knit one row.</p>

### Chemo Cap Continued

	<p>Knit 4, knit two together. Repeat to end. At this time, you will need to change to double pointed needles because there are not enough stitches to go around on the circular needles.</p>
	<p>Knit one row.</p> <p>Knit 3, knit 2 together. Repeat to end of row. Knit 2, knit 2 together. Repeat to end of row. Knit 1, knit 2 together. Repeat to end of row.</p> <p>Cut thread in a long tail about 10 inches long. With a crochet hook, pull tail through the loops on the needles. Once the tail is through the loops, remove the loop from the knitting needles. Pull the tail tight through the loops, closing off the top of the cap.</p>
	<p>Pull tail inside the cap and weave the ends into the inside of the cap. Weave in all loose threads.</p>



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
